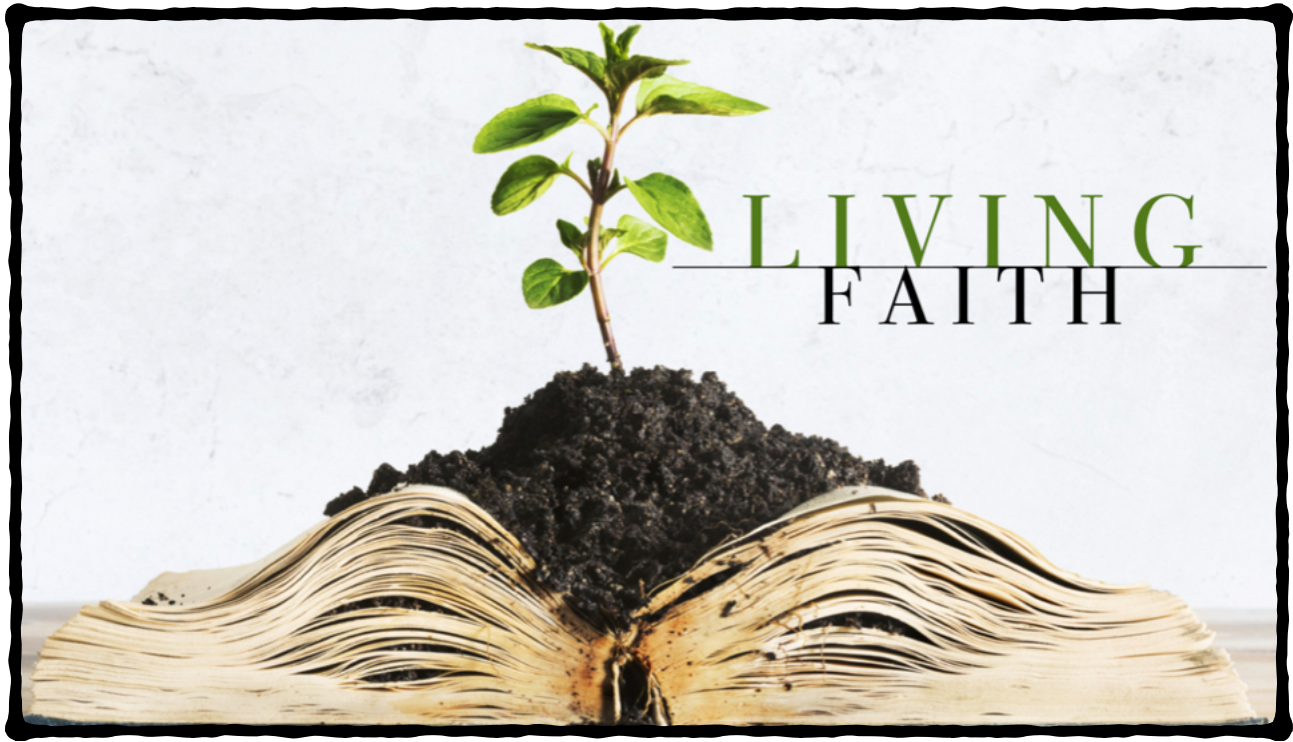

## A message:



**Georgia, Ukraine, Russia, Cyprus, Malta, Romania, Greece, Prussia and Scotland.**

**Can you think of anything all these countries have in common?** Do not worry. I am not about to start one of my Geography lessons!

To give some context to this reading, at this point in Jesus' life, His followers were Jews and they felt the message was for

only the Jews. Therefore, when Greeks wanted to see Jesus, Philip was thrown into confusion. This is why he goes to Andrew for advice. Andrew was very open to spreading the Word to more than just the Jews, long before the rest of the disciples. From this point on, Andrew fades from the Bible story, but, despite not being a person that is mentioned often and portrayed as a leader, he was definitely respected. His advice was listened to. He was a forward thinker. He was one with vision.

Andrew's life and work was all about bringing people to Jesus. Indeed, he was eventually killed for this. As a result, he is remembered as the patron saint of Georgia, Ukraine, Russia, Cyprus, Malta, Romania, Greece, Prussia and Scotland. The clarity and focus of his vision is something to learn from. We can see the importance of firm foundations, being steadfast in our faith and having clear vision.
